The Importance of Regular School Attendance

We want to thank parents for recognising the value and importance of regular attendance at school, which allows children to learn more about the world, develop learning, skills and knowledge. It also plays a vital role in fostering and strengthening friendships. At St Margaret Mary's School, we believe that everyday skills are developed through engaging and challenging experiences, making consistent attendance key to your child's success.

It's important to consider the long-term impact of a child's absence from school. *We understand that when a child is unwell, home is the best place for them.* However, when not unwell, even a day off here and there can add up. The table below illustrates how these occasional absences can accumulate, resulting in significant weeks of lost learning over time.

Please come and speak with your child's teacher or a member of the leadership team if you are concerned about your child's attendance. Your child's attendance will be recorded on your child's semester report. Regular attendance allows teachers to best support your child's learning and wellbeing.

1 day absent a fortnight equates to 10.5 days absent in Semester 1.

1 day absent a week equates to 21 days absent in Semester 1.

SACPSSA Swimming Carnival





Aussie Hoops - Run by the West Adelaide Bearcats

Aussie Hoops is an initiative of Basketball Australia and is the National Introductory Basketball Program for children aged 5-10.

Aussie Hoops Clinics are run weekly by various Basketball SA affiliated Clubs (like the Bearcats) and at centres across metropolitan Adelaide. During the program children are taught how to bounce the ball, pass and shoot while playing fun games in the process!

Where: Multiple location options including Port Adelaide, Osborne, Flinders Park, and West Beach.

Sessions: 50 mins sessions run over 8 weeks.


Cost: The program runs for 8 sessions and is \$80 per child (plus \$9.90 insurance & Basketball Australia levies) (\$89.90 total).

There are also Aussie Hoops merchandise packs available to purchase separately at checkout.

This is a great beginner program for players to learn some of the basic fundamentals for ages 5 to 10.
