## From the Principal



Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been great to welcome back all our students this week! The first 2 weeks were a little different, but we were all very appreciative and impressed with the way our Year 3-6 students handled their online learning. We also thank the parents for their support with this.

### **Staffing Updates**

We are pleased to welcome Alicia Boylan back to the role of Assistant Principal. We also welcome Julie Bottger who is our Preschool teacher this year. Matthew Harrison has commenced his role as Assistant Principal (Religious Education and Mission) and Sandra Shepard will be supporting students as an ESO Mon-Wed. I'm sure they will feel very welcomed in our community.

#### Learning Highlights

Although we all have COVID-19 procedures on our minds, we are also very excited about the fantastic learning that we have planned for first term. Our Reception-Year 2 students have all started their **InitiaLit** program of learning. Teachers have 'screened' all students to give them an accurate indication of where the students are at with their literacy learning. This data then guides the planning for R-2 students. We are still planning to hold some information sessions for parents outlining the InitiaLit program later in the term (our planned sessions have had to be postponed). In the meantime, we will share some information on SeeSaw, and please contact your child's teacher, or myself, if you'd like to discuss the program in more detail.

We are also currently looking at our Year 3-6 data to determine students who can be a part of our **MacqLit** program of intervention. This program is designed for older students who may need some extra support to develop their reading skills. The program runs 4 times per week, with a trained educator. Students involved will receive a letter with more information for parents.

St Margaret Mary's School and Preschool now have a **Speech Pathologist** on staff one day a week. We have been able to offer this position through funding received through a 'Partnerships in Inclusive Practice' grant from Catholic Education SA. Jessica Curnow will be supporting our teachers (mainly Preschool and Reception) in early detection and intervention support for language difficulties. We are very excited to have this service and support available for our students.

This week, our Year 6 students began their **podcasting** units with ArchD Radio. In this program they will explore aspects of the curriculum, initially History and Social Sciences, whilst learning the skills of podcasting. Their podcasts will be available to listen to on

Spotify and Apple Podcasts!

And...all of this has happened in just 2 weeks! I look forward to sharing a lot more learning over the term.

#### **Healthy Eating and Drinking**

We are asking that students only bring WATER to school to drink. We will have spare water bottles available for students who do not bring a water bottle or bring other drinks to school.

We ask that you limit sugary treats, chips and packaged food in your child's lunch box. Each child needs to have some fresh fruit or veg (healthy snack/brain food) each day. Here are some good tips about what to pack for your child's lunch.

#### Safety Concerns

Please be extra patient around the school at pick up time – it gets very congested. Students are supervised until 3.20pm, so try coming at 3.10-3.20pm as the traffic is lighter.

Adults are role models for children, so please always use the school crossing. I was alarmed at how many parents walked straight across Tungara Ave (NOT at the crossing) with very young children.

Drivers that do not follow the road rules are reported to SAPOL. This includes doing a three-point turn near the school crossing and driving on the wrong side of the road to pass a waiting car.

### 2022 Fees

Dear Parents and Carers,

Hope you are settling in to the 2022 school year amongst all the craziness.

If you have a Health Care Card or Pension Card you may be eligible for lower income fees. Please bring your current card with you as you will need to fill in the School Card Application form for 2022 or it can be accessed online at SA Gov > School Card Scheme.

This form needs to be filled out every year and we need to send these completed forms to the School Card Department of the State Government next week. School Card is a State Government Scheme and therefore approval is not done at a school level. Because of this we do not send out school fee accounts at the School Card rate until we receive formal approval from the State Government which is usually April or May.

As usual we will invoice the 2022 school and preschool fees in full at the beginning of the year. These will be posted home in the next couple of weeks. If a payment plan is not in place these fees can be paid – as in previous years – over three terms. Please do not delay making payment because your School Card reduction has not yet been approved. The due dates for these fees are:

- Friday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2022
- Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022
- Friday 19<sup>th</sup> August 2022

Please come and see me if you have any questions or would like to set up a payment plan.
