We congratulate and hold in our prayers Senna, Katia and Rocio who received the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday 22 March for the first time. Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, our young people and their families reflect on their conscience through the themes of love and forgiveness. This week, Levi, Zac, Phi Khoi, Lachlan, Mary, Taye and Mason will also receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time on Saturday 29 March. The Reconciliation ceremonies are held in St Margaret Mary's Church from 11:00am.

On **Monday 7 April**, the students will participate in a '**Big Water Walk.**' This fundraising event is inspired by Caritas Australia's Project Compassion stories. Each year, Project Compassion helps raise our student's awareness. Students learn that many children around the world do not have access to water at school.
