Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Last Sunday, we rejoiced in the Ascension of the Lord and this week we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. These are two of the most significant feasts in the liturgical calendar. Before his Ascension, Christ spent forty days teaching the Apostles and disciples about their responsibility to share the Kingdom of God with others. To do this, Jesus promised them that they would receive guidance from the Holy Spirit. Pentecost meaning fiftieth, always occurs 50 days after the death and Resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Pentecost celebrates the fulfilment of Jesus' promise to the Apostles to send a helper and guide.

On Tuesday 24 May (Week 4), our Confirmation candidates were invited to attend an Information Evening for the 'Sacrament of Confirmation' at Whitefriars Catholic School.




### Minha


